CYCLONE



✓ Do's

- ✓ Check your house; secure loose tiles and carry out repairs of roofs, doors, and windows.
- ✓ Remove dead branches close to your house; and anchor removable objects which can fly in strong winds.
- ✓ If required safely move to the nearest cyclone shelter and ensure safety of your animals.
- ✓ Keep a lantern filled with kerosene, battery operated torches and enough dry cells.
- ✓ Ensure your buildings are insured, retrofit weak structures, and demolish non-reparable structures.
- ✓ Stay safely indoors till it is officially announced that the cyclone has passed.
- ✓ Strong winds can damage doors and windows, keep them secured.
- ✓ Return to your home after confirmation by the authorities and check for all safety measures.
- ✓ Ensure you and your family members get inoculated against diseases immediately.
- ✓ If you must drive, do drive carefully. Keep vehicles, tractors, and metallic objects away from trees.
- ✓ Report the correct damages and losses to the appropriate authorities.

✗ Don'ts

- ✗ Don't venture out and please do stay away from the sea or river.
- ✗ Don't venture out even when the winds appear to calm down, as winds might intensify and cause damage.
- ✗ Don't stand or park vehicles under trees.
- ✗ Don't keep animals tied under trees.
- ✗ Don't go close to any loose and dangling wires from lamp posts or the surrounding structures.
- ✗ Don't leave shelters until informed by the local government authorities.

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
